

ICAR-IVRI, Mukteswar organized training on “Prevention and control of infectious diseases in goats ” under AICRP on Goat at Kanra village, Almora, Uttarakhand

14th January 2019, Mukteswar: ICAR-Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Mukteswar campus organized three days training programme on “Prevention and control of infectious diseases in goats” under AICRP on Goat Improvement at Kanra village, Almora, Uttarakhand from 8th - 10th January 2019. A total of 25 farmers participated under this programme. The importance of goat husbandry for livelihood security in hill region was briefed during inaugural session by Dr C. Jana, PI, AICRP on Goat Improvement. The programme covered different aspects of diseases in goat and its control measures viz. (i) Major bacterial, viral and parasitic diseases of small ruminants (ii) Vaccination and deworming schedule in goats (iii) Various field diagnostic methods to detect infection in goats (iv) Zoonotic diseases of goat and its impact on human health and (v) Current scenario of FMD in livestock at hills and its control measures. In this programme, three practical classes were also conducted viz. Vaccination in goats and methods of disinfection of goat shed, body temperature recording and oral administration of anthelmintic drugs and application of ectoparasitocidal drugs. On concluding day, farmer-scientist interaction was conducted with collection of feedback from participants. Animal health check up and FMD vaccination in goats was also carried out on concluding day of training. The programme was coordinated by Dr. M Sankar Sr. Scientist, Dr. Amol Gurav and Dr. Siddharth Gautam, Scientist, TAH division, IVRI, Mukteswar. In addition, Dr. S. K. Gupta, Dr. S. Chandra Sekar, Scientist, Division of Virology, Dr. Sagar A. Khulape, Scientist, ICAR-DFMD, Mukteswar shared their field experiences during interaction with farmers. Pre and post training evaluation was also undertaken to assess the impact of training.
