

TEC, ICAR - Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Pune, organised an Animal Health Camp on 5th October 2017 at *Rautwadi* village of Pune District

An Animal Health Camp was organised on 5th October 2017 at *Rautwadi* village, Purandar Taluka of Pune Dist. in collaboration with KNP College of Veterinary Science (MAFSU), Shirwal, Satara and State Animal Husbandry Department, Govt of Maharashtra. Dr SK Das and Dr HP Aithal, Principal Scientists of the Centre, five faculty members and several PG students of KNP College of Veterinary Science, Shirwal, and local Livestock Development Officer of the State Department and his team participated in the programme.

About 145 livestock consisting of cattle, buffaloes, goats and sheep of 38 farmers were treated in the health camp for various ailments. Most common cases were infestation of ectoparasites and endoparasites, debility, anoestrus, repeat breeding, prolapse, and metritis etc. Besides, arrangements were also made for vaccination of animals against FMD and tagging with NAPH numbers. The response was overwhelming and the news was also covered in local newspaper.
