At the outset, Dr Gyanendra Singh, Senior Registrar & Member Secretary, Academic Council welcome the Chairman, Members of the Academic Council, Joint Director(s), Head of Divisions and Station Incharges.

Dr S.K. Mendiratta, Joint Director (Academic) & Vice Chairman of the Academic Council extended his heartiest welcome to all the honorable members of the house specially Dr M.S. Chauhan, Vice Chancellor, GBPUAT, Pantnagar, Dr Amresh Kumar, Former Dean (Vety. Science) & (Student Welfare), GBPUAT, Pantnagar, Dr O.P. Dhanda, Former, ADG (AN&P), ICAR and Dr P.K. Shukla, Dean (Vety. Science) & Registrar, DUVASU, Mathura. He briefed the House about the academic activities, e-Governance and recent achievements of IVRI Deemed to be University. He informed that the Accreditation of Deemed University have been done by National Agricultural Education Accreditation Board of ICAR for next five years and application for NIRF ranking (National Institutional Ranking framework) of MHRD has been submitted. He also informed that out of total 39 posts of ARS scientists related to Vety and animal sciences disciplines, 25 students have been selected from IVRI Deemed University. Under CAAST project, during last six months, 7 faculty members and 13 Ph.D students were deputed for overseas trainings for one & three months respectively. Till now total 50 PG students and 21 faculty members completed international training under CAAST project (Center for advanced agricultural science and technology-NAHEP). Joint Director (Academic) also briefed about the Student Welfare activities undertaken during last six months.

The Vice Chancellor & Chairman of the Academic Council Dr Triveni Dutt, extended his heartiest welcome to all the Honorable expert members of the House i.e. Dr M.S. Chauhan, Vice Chancellor, GBPUAT, Pantnagar and Dr Amresh Kumar, Former Dean (Vety. Science) & (Students Welfare), GBPUAT, Pantnagar, Dr O.P. Dhanda, Former, ADG (AN &P), ICAR and Dr P.K. Shukla, Dean (Vety. Science) & Registrar, DUVASU, Mathura. The Chairman briefed the House about the successful conduction of 10th Convocation of IVRI & activities and recent achievements of ICAR-IVRI, technology developed & vaccines released. The Chairman also briefed about other important vaccines & technologies of National interest that will be released very soon. The Chairman appreciated the initiatives taken by the IVRI Deemed University. The Chairman further expressed the need to revisit our priorities in view of Government directives/ decisions and the requirement of livestock holders. The Chairman informed the House about the progress of starting GMP-GLP facility in the Institute and plan to develop BSL-3 facility at all three campuses of the Institute. The Chairman expressed hope to achieve the targets with the help of esteemed colleagues of ICAR-IVRI, Izatnagar and its Campuses/ Regional Stations/Regional Centres.

Dr. P.K. Shukla, Hon'ble Member in his remark appreciated the initiative of collaboration of IVRI with RVC Centre & College, Meerut for accreditation of different certificate courses. He appreciated the proposal of increase in amount of internship of UG students.

Dr. O.P. Dhanda, Hon'ble Member welcomed the new members of Academic Council and hoped that their knowledge and vast experience will be fruitful for the House. He said that without resources it is very difficult to run proposed courses under NEP, 2020.

Dr. Amresh Kumar, Hon'ble Member appreciated the work done by the IVRI in the field of research, development of vaccine and technology. He also appreciated the academic activities of the Deemed University.

Dr. M.S. Chauhan, Hon'ble Member in his remark expressed great satisfaction on the research capability of IVRI scientists. He praised the scientist for getting good number of outside funded projects. He appreciated the remarkable work done on development of vaccines by the IVRI. He also said that proposal of One scientist-one product and start of 03 schools is very good initiative. He pointed out that for betterment of student/education, student-faculty ratio should be maintained.

Dr. Gyanendra Singh, Senior Registrar made a brief presentation on the academic activities of previous years/ courses conducted/ offered & other co-curriculum activities of Deemed University. He informed the House that Deemed University has already implemented the ICAR restructured and revised syllabus for PG program (BSMA) from the session 2021-22. In addition, IVRI has signed 03 MoU with Universities/ Institutes. As per Government / ICAR decision, IVRI is implementing NEP 2020 in the Deemed University.
