

# ICAR-IVRI NEH Program: Input Distribution to Farmers

## CoVSc&AH Jalukie Nagaland, 18 March 2025

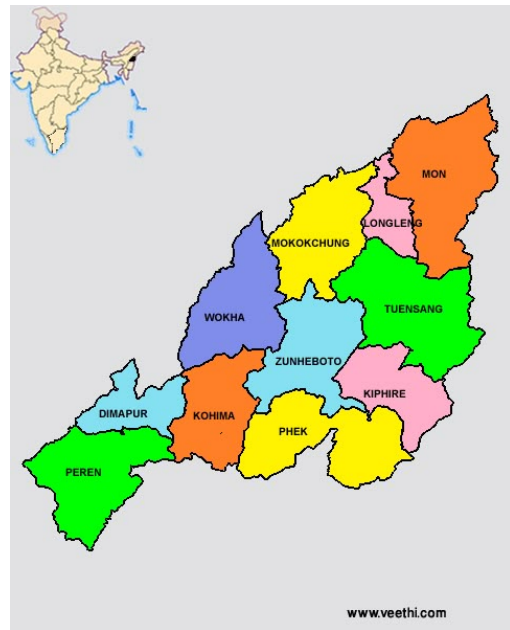
A Farmer-Scientist Interaction-cum-Technology Distribution Program was organized by the ICAR-Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Eastern Regional Station (IVRI-ERS), Kolkata in collaboration with the College of Veterinary Sciences & Animal Husbandry, Central Agricultural University (Imphal), Jalukie on 18th March on campus under the ICAR-IVRI NEH Program.



The program was initiated and orchestrated by Dr Arnab Sen, HoRC ERS IVRI Kolkata with the help of Dr G.K. Das, Principal Scientist, ERS Kolkata. The program was executed at the Jalukie with the registration of farmers and felicitation of dignitaries. Dr. K. Mahesh Singh, Asst. Prof., CVSc&AH, Jalukie delivered the welcome address followed by the address of Dr. B. Mondal, Principal Scientist, IVRI ERS, Kolkata, and address of Dr. I. Shakuntala, Dean, CoV&AH, Jalukie. Three lectures on Selection of Improved Breeds for Profitable Livestock Farming, Goat Rearing & Management, and Pig Rearing & Management were delivered respectively by Dr. K. Mahesh Singh, Dr. T. Gyaneshori Devi, and Dr. Imtiwati, Asst. Prof., CVSc&AH, Jalukie. The farmer-scientist interaction followed, culminating in the vote of thanks by Dr. Amrit Gogoi, Asst. Prof., CVSc&AH, Jalukie. There were question-answer session and queries of the farmers were addressed to their satisfaction.



**Input distribution:** The program concluded with the distribution of 60 piglets, 40 kids (goat) and 180 bags (50 Kg each) of feed (60 bags pig grower, 60 bags poultry starter, 60 bags goat feed) to 51 farmers. There were 51 beneficiaries (26 male, 25 female) of which 29 people received 02 piglets each and 02 persons got 01 piglet each and 20 persons received 02 kids each. All the 51 beneficiaries received poultry feed, 45 persons received pig feed and 44 persons received goat feed.



Total 9 villages were covered under **Peren District** of Nagaland: 11 farmers from Jalukie Pungchi village; 10 farmers from Nkwareu village; 16 from New Peren village; 5 from Peren Town; 1 from Samzuiram village; 4 from Jalukie B village ; 2 from Jalukie Town; 1 from Mpai village; 1 from Khinghutomi village.
