

1. **Title of the Practice:** Implementation of Fellowship/Scholarship and Contingencies to the students of IVRI

2. **Objectives:**

- To promote and strengthen the students to pursue their educational, career or intellectual goals with reduced monetary strains.
- To support and promote the poor students in higher studies.
- The annual research contingencies are also being paid to students for purchase of books, chemicals, attending conferences/symposia and other important material required for research work.

3. **The Context:** Scholarships provide financial support to make education accessible and affordable to the middle and poor class of the students. They reward deserving students with the ability to afford higher education at national institute which is one of the dreams of the veterinary students to study in Indian Veterinary Research Institute *“The Mecca Madina of Veterinary Science”*. All the payments are made through online modes to the students account and therefore the details of the beneficiaries are checked multiple times before submission of data on government operated portal PFMS for final payment.

4. **The Practice:**

The ICAR-IVRI is giving the fellowship to the all students. The fellowship is not based on the caste system of the students. The practice of giving fellowship is *“Cent percent fellowship”*. It is also helpful in promoting Veterinary Science education field among the students. Scholarships provide financial support to make education accessible and affordable. Fellowship is Provided to all the UG, PG and Ph.D. students enrolled in this Deemed University from the date of admission till the date of completion of course. Fellowship released directly to the account of students through DBT mode. Various fellowships are being paid currently to students i.e ICAR JRF/SRF, ICAR NTS, ICMR, DBT, CSIR, NSP, UGC NFSC, NFOBC, NET JRF etc.
